Who are CLL Support Champions?

They are a network of members who volunteer to help to promote the Charity and its work.

What do they do?

Helping set up and facilitate conferences. Telling your "CLL story". Note taking. Support set up and run local support groups

Lobbying and Media Support Champions

Contacting, briefing, lobby support of MPs. PR with local media to raise awareness. Supporting Newsletter

Help line Champions

Staffing the line, collating topics of calls for common "Q and A" section of Website.

Digital Champions

Helping to promote CLL Support on social media. Managing blogs, Facebook page, online Forum adjudication, Group emails.

Each Champion is focussed on a role, and it should not take up a lot of your time but will have a great impact on the work we do.

How are CLL Support Champions supported?

- A Trustee is appointed with the responsibility for the support of the Champions Network.
- CLL Support leaflets and other information will be supplied for distribution within surgeries and clinics.
- Support will also be provided to those who agree to speak at conferences or attend meetings to represent the Charity.
- Briefing papers will be available for lobbying campaigns.
- Promotional material is available for fund raising activities and if Corporate fundraising - a Trustee would provide support.

• Training can be made available for Helpline or Buddy support roles.

The Champions Network of volunteers is key to the success of CLL Support and its objective of reaching out to, and helping, as many of those in the U.K. affected by CLL and SLL and their supporters as possible.

Success in growing our membership numbers is dependent on those diagnosed with CLL/SLL having knowledge of the Charity and how we can help them live well with CLL/SLL.
